The County of Delaware Office of Services for the Aging’s Domiciliary Care or “Dom Care” program provides an *alternative* housing option to people age 18 years and older unable to live independently due to a physical, cognitive or visual disability.

The Dom Care program depends on *caring* and *compassionate* residents that are willing to open their homes and hearts to individuals in need of a little extra support with their activities of daily living; but still wish to maintain as much independence as possible in a homelike setting.

- Do you have an empty room in your home?

- Are you interested in receiving a tax free stipend for sharing your home?



- Dom Care providers do more than just give room and board. Providers help with laundry, supervise medication usage, provide three nutritious meals a day, reinforce good personal hygiene, coordinate medical appointments, as well as give caring and individualized attention.
- Dom Care providers receive a non-taxable monthly stipend for Dom Care residents. If you have a generous spirit and available space in your home, consider becoming a Dom Care provider.
- Ranch-style homes and homes with a bathroom on the first floor preferred; access to nearby public transportation essential.
- Homes must be in Delaware County.
